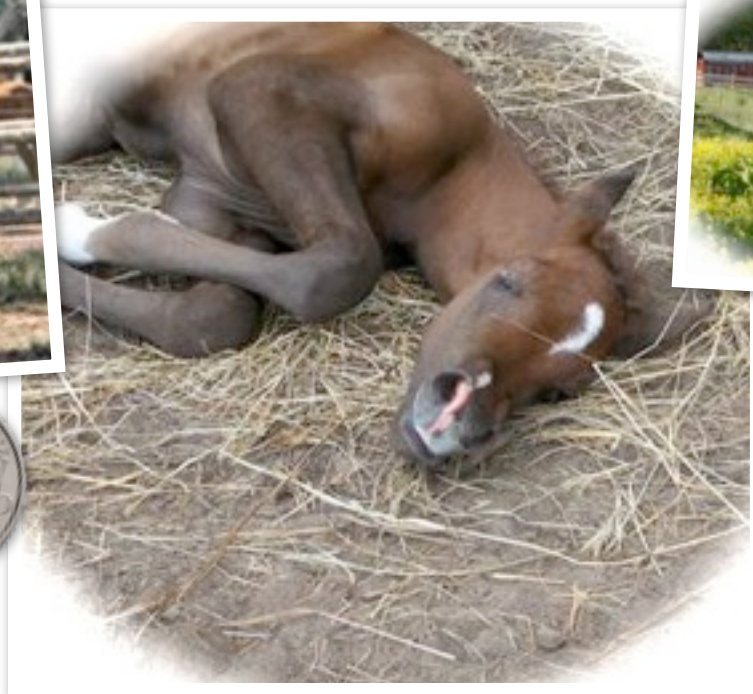

2008 Grey Polish/Crabbet Arabian Stallion

Jrs Legacy of Naborr is a grey stallion born in August of 2008.

His sire, **TC Mr. Lucky** almost did not come to exist. **TC Mr. Lucky**'s dam, **Lady Luck**, was sold at the February 2, 1976 Tom Chancey - The Naborr Generation sale, with the instruction that she would sell with a breeding at the age of three by a Tom Chancey stallion other than ***Naborr**. She was number Lot 25 and her sale description is as follows:

With her beautiful, moving trot, **LADY LUCK**, is definite Park potential and a good racing prospect, being the daughter of National Champion Race Horse ***ORZEL**, who also went Top Ten in Park both in U.S. and Canada and National Champion Sidesaddle. His sire **PIET'USZOK** also sired ***BAJRAM** and ***GAYPOLKA**. **LADY LUCK** is a half sister to **TC GRAND SLAM** both being out of the **Wielki Szlem** daughter ***NAWOJKA**.

Lady Luck was sold at this sale for \$32,000.00. However, the buyer defaulted and Tom took back this lovely mare and bred her to ***Naborr** and **TC Mr. Lucky** was born just a few



months before his sire would leave this world. On a side note regarding **Lady Luck's** sire, ***Orzel**

AHR#41019 and PASB#2257, was a Legion of Merit and Race winner/sire; National Champion Race Horse; National Champion Sidesaddle; National Top Ten Halter and National Top Ten English Pleasure. ***Orzel's** sire's

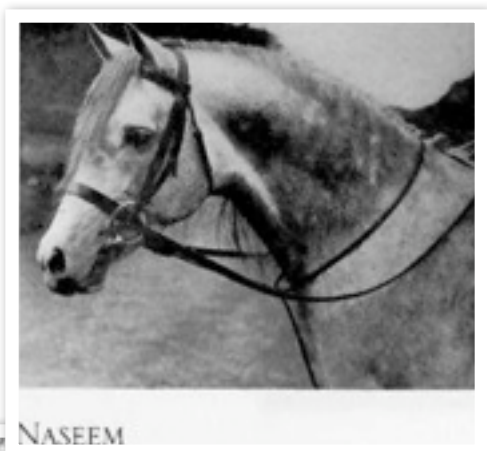


sire, **Priboj** RASB#313, won the Russian Autumn Prize and the Russian Derby. **Priboj** (straight Russian) sired 26 Stakes Winners and 19 Stakes Placed. ***Orzel's** sire's dam, **Taktika** RASB#254 (Russian Aristocrat Dam), won the USSR All Union Exhibition when shown in hand against all breeds based on Conformation and Class. She was esteemed for outstanding conformation, size and substance, excellent scope and harmony of build, a dry, refined and solid constitution as well as tremendously powerful and versatile athletic ability. She was the epitome of the original Russian blend, with strong influences of Polish and Russian lines combined with her infinitely valuable Crabbet-bred grandam **Star of the Hills**. Still considered a premier source of racing talent in the breed, the descendants of Taktika are valued as superior athletes with model conformation, strength, substance, class and courage. **TC Mr. Lucky's** sire, ***Naborr**, cannot be

described in just a few words. Here is a stallion who was a champion as well as successful sire in Moscow, survived a two month old trip on a sail ship - encountering terrible storms, was bought at auction in 1969 at the age of 19 for \$150,000, and produced 150 champions and 46 National champions until the age of 27 years old. But of course, one would expect this from a line know for its tremendous stamina and endurance as it was once almost lost to the world.

In 1936, the Soviet Union purchased a 14 year old Skowronek son named Naseem, out of Nasra from Lady Judith Wentworth, of England's Crabbet Park Stud. Naseem was of excellent Seglawi type and was thought to be the best of Skowronek's sons. With startling consistency, the get of Naseem were blessed with his superior type and elegant forehead, characterized by a small, beautifully refined and dished head with large, dark, expressive eyes and an incredibly long, superbly shaped neck with an extremely fine and supple throatlatch. Though on the small side (14hh), his build was nonetheless strong and solid, with dry desert constitution, an especially good shoulder and foreleg as well as excellent motion. Three years later, in 1939, Hitler invaded Poland and the Russians attacked Poland from the east in an attempt to protect their borders. They soon "liberated" the one remaining Arabian stud, Janow Podlaski, and confiscated the 50 best horses, who were shipped to Tersk. Among these horses was *Naborr's dam - Lagodna and Taraszczka, *Naborr's

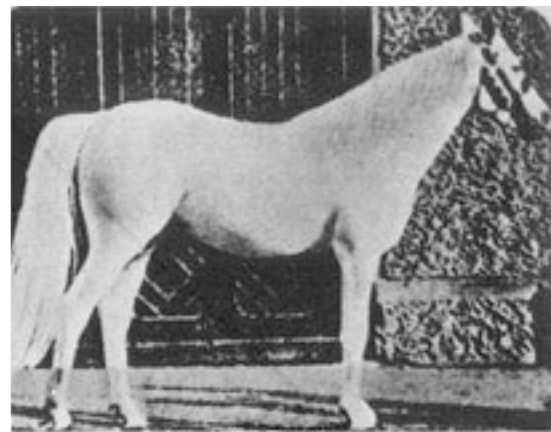

paternal grandam. In 1941, Hitler directly invaded Russia, and the Tersk horses were evacuated. However, the process of moving horses undetected through German patrols was extremely difficult and hazardous and because of this, many were left in country mansions or peasants cottages when they were injured or exhausted. The mares walked the 1,000 -plus miles to safety in the Trans-Caspian area and was return to Tersk in 1943.

It was in 1944 when the Soviets bred **Taraszcza** of Poland to **Naseem** of England to produce the stallion **Negatiw**, 1954 National Champion, Poland race winner and sire of many race winners. **Negatiw** was credited as the stallion that returned the **Ibrahim** sire to Poland and was highly regarded around the world as the most internationally influential grandson of the immortal **Skowronek**. **Negatiw** was described as "extremely dry and refined, with a small, chiseled head accented by beautifully large, dark and luminous eyes and small ears. His legs were relatively correct and his back and topline were strong and a bit long. As a stallion, he was strikingly refined and distinguished-he represented a rare example of perfection." When **Negatiw** was the age of four, he was then bred to the Polish-born **Lagodna** (**Posejdon** x **Obra**), resulting in the incredible foal **Naborr**. **Negatiw** is the sire of eight National winners including Canadian National Champion English Pleasure ***Tinian**. Twenty-eight of **Negatiw** gets have produced National winners.



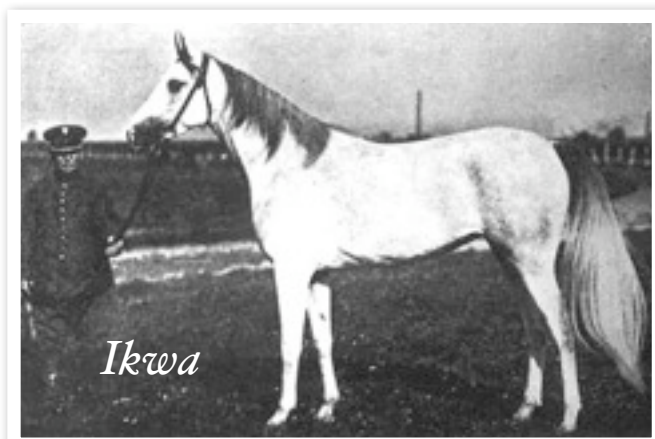

Lagodna's pedigree is unique as it shows a very precious inbred on sire Ibrahim (original Arabian bloodline). Lagodna's mother, Obra was doubly inbred on the mare Lezginka whose stock was famous for saddle horses renowned for strength, good paces, and utility. Obra's sire, Hardy was renowned for his great racing capabilities. Obra's dam, Ikwa, was also an excellent racing horse as she captured the Oaks price in the Lwow race-course in 1931.

And for those that study pedigrees, Naborr has three crosses to Ibrahim through Skowronek, Posejdon and Ikwa. However, Naborr is not considered CMK definition and his Crabbet influence through Naseem does count 25% when calculating the qualifying CMK percentages.

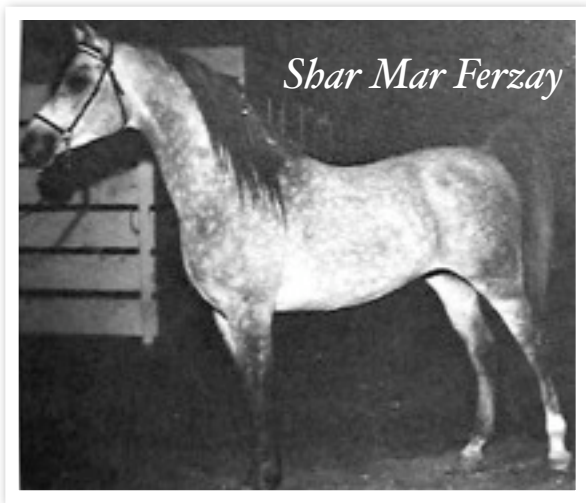
Trs Legacy of Naborr's dam is Princess

La-Godna, a grey crabbet/polish bred mare out of HHH Korene by Fala Tithonus. HHH Korene is by the Region 13 Reserve Champion Stallion Zoris (*Aramus x Gazrona) and out of Shar Mar Tyrene (Shar Mar Ferzay x Shar-Mar Tyraffa). Zoris's sire *Aramus became famous for two reasons - in 1970 he won both the U.S. and Canadian National Champion Stallion titles and was owned by the famous entertainer Wayne Newton. *Aramus was also a Canadian National Park Champion and U.S. National Formal Driving Champion who sired 11 National winners and his daughters are highly prized as broodmares. Bred by The Michalow State Sud Farm and imported by Lloyd Burnton, Bill & Janet Lowe owned *Aramus with Wayne Newton

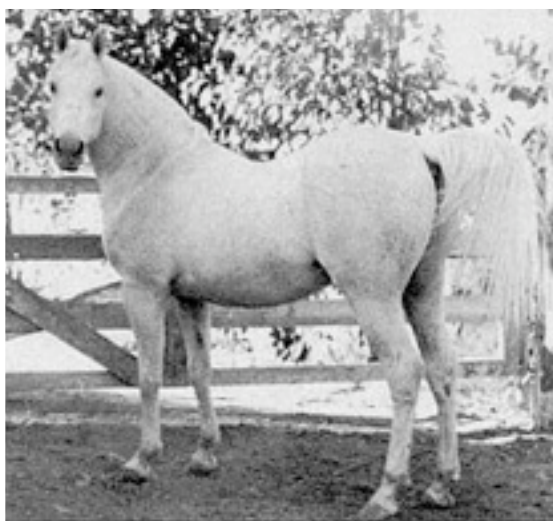

until December 17, 1972 when Wayne became the sole owner. *Aramus is the son of the famous *Naborr. HHH Korene's dam's sire is Shar Mar Ferzay who was just briefly shown and placed within the top five (out of 20's) of his class. Shar Mar Ferzay was one of two famous son's of halter champion Ferzon. Ferzon was the result of line breeding domestic Arabians who descended from the Crabbet/Blunt Stock, whose major representatives in the United States were sons of Skowronek, the Polish-bred Arabian stallion acquired by Lady Wentworth of the Crabbet Stud. Though pictures from the early 1950s reveal Ferzon as a dark-colored ordinary colt, McCoy showed Ferzon himself and walked away with a many ribbons while bringing distinction to Ferzon and his close equine relatives in California. For instance, on March 29, 1953, Ferzon was named reserve Champion stallion at the Palm Desert, California, First Annual All Arabian Show. At the same show Ferneyn, Ferzon's sire, took the grand championship. Moneyyna, the dam of Ferneyn, was named reserve champion mare, while Hasa, a half sister to Ferneyn by Ferseyn, was the grand champion mare. This show was the beginning of clear evidence that the influence of Ferseyn was to be felt for a long time.

On June 7, 1953, in Long Beach, California, **Ferzon** won the yearling colt championship, followed by the yearling colt championship at the Desert Arabian Association of San Diego on July 18, 1953. Again he placed second to his own sire, **Ferneyn**

(**Raseyn** x **Ferda**), in the stallion championship. On August 8, 1953, **Ferzon** was reserve champion yearling colt with his close relative, **Fadjur**, placing fourth.

On September 26, 1953, **Ferzon** was the champion yearling colt at the Los Angeles County Fair. For the next three decades horses such as **Gazon**, Galatina, Raffon, Gavrelle, Gai Adventure, Gaizon, Ga-Rageyma, Gafferra, Ga-Gajala, **Shar Mar Ferzay** and Gai Champion became famous in their own right and helped perpetuate the Gainey "look". **Ferzon** was a Champion stallion who sired 24 National Winners, 50 producers of National winners and 82 Champions. **SHAR MAR FERZAY** is out of **LEWSFIELD MAGNOLIA**, a paternal sister to U.S. National Champion Mares **LALLEGRA** and **IMARFA++** and to U.S. Reserve National Champion Park **HILLCRESTS IMAZETTE** and U.S. Reserve National Champion Western Pleasure **AOTR BIG DEAL ++**. **LEWISFIELD MAGNOLIA** is a $\frac{3}{4}$ sister to U.S. Top Ten Mare **URFRAFFA**, who is also by a ***RAFFLES** son out of **KOTLA**.

LEWISFIELD MAGNOLIA is a maternal sister to *DANN DEES RAFFLA*, dam of U.S. Top Ten Stallion *AOTH TO BOLERO*.

Princess La-Godna's sire, *Fala Tithonus* is by *Ferlaine* (*Serazon* x *Shahrol*) and out of *Jameelia*

(*Jameel Rujahid* x *Zarrida*).

Serazon was a US Top Ten Stallion by *Ferdine* and out of *Biya*. *Jameel Rujahid* was

1965 Canadian Top Ten Stallion and Estes Park - Great Plains Top Five Stallion. *Jameel Rujahid*'s sire is *Mujahid ++* (*Sureyn* x *Silver Crystal*) and his dam is *Al-Marah Ruwala*. *Mujahid ++* was the first US National Champion Stallion at Halter (1958) and is IAHA Legion of Merit winner. His sire, *Sureyn* (whose 19 National winning get include the first US National Champion Stallion and Mare), is the son of **Raseyn* and **Crabbet Sura* (both by *Skowronek* and imported). *Raseyn* was bred by Crabbet Arabian Stud in England and imported to the United States of America in 1926 by W.K. Kellogg. He was the 1933 Los Angeles County Fair Champion Arabian Stallion. He was also one of the few Arabians with the talent of being able to rack. *Jameel Rujahid*'s dam, *Al-Marah Ruwala* (*Indraff* x *Rose Marie* - both by **Raffles*), sold for \$10,000 in 1956 at Al-Marah's first auction. It was the highest price known to have ever been paid for an Arabian mare at auction at that time. *Al-Marah Ruwala*'s dam, *Rose Marie* AHR#4168, was one of the most beautiful of the **Raffles* daughters and an outstanding producer who produced 11 registered purebred Arabian foals - all for Al-Marah. She was

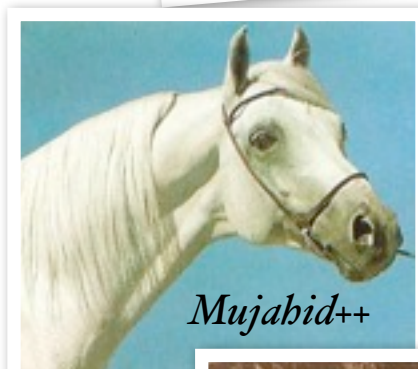

owned by Bazy Tankersley most of her life and was 1958 Top Ten Mare. **Al-Marah Ruwala's** sire, **Indruff** AHR#1575 (***Raffles** x **Indaia** AHR#813), was 1948 Waterloo, Iowa, National Stallion Show Champion with fifteen 1st Place wins, 100% Crabbet, ***Raffles** first son and the foundation sire for Al-Marah Arabians. ***Raffles**, the 1933 Nashville National Show Three-Gaited Champion, is the son and grandson of the great Lady Wentworth's World Champion stallion **Skowronek** and son to the 1922 English and 1923 American Champion ***Rifala**. ***Rifala's** grandsire on the dam's side, ***Berk** AHR#343, was celebrated for his brilliant trotting action and was imported in 1918 by W.R. Brown. ***Rifala's** dam, **Rissla**, won first prize at the Richmond Royal Show, the only time shown. **Rissla's** dam **Risala** (**Mesaoud** x **Ridaa**) was Sheykh Obeyd Straight Egyptian.
