



JRs Von Imperial

2002 Egyptian Sired Mare



JRs Von Imperial's sire, *Imperial Im Mamul*, was bred by Imperial Arabian Stud Farm. He is a winner in Halter, English Pleasure and Eventing and is by the famous *Ansata Imperial* and out of *Imperial Mamoulah* (*Serenity Osiris* daughter). *Ansata Imperial* needs no introduction as he was a Top Ten Futurity Stallion and sire of many National Straight Egyptian Champions. *Ansata Imperial* is sired by *Ansata Ibn Sudan* and out of *Ansata Delilah*. *Ansata Ibn Sudan*, named for the famous bedouin breeder, Ibn Sudan, became 1969 US National Top Ten in halter as a four-year old, together with his father, **Ansata Ibn Halima*, a rare event. In 1971, competing against 83 champion stallions, Sudan became the first US National Champion Stallion of straight Egyptian bloodlines. **Ansata Ibn Halima*, bred by the Egyptian Agricultural Organization (EAO), he was imported to the United States in 1959 by Don and Judith Forbis. He was shown to 5 championships and 2 reserves in Park, 7 championships and 5 reserves in Halter, and 3 first places in Most Classic. He also won Top Ten at the U.S. Nationals 3 times, the third of which his son *Ansata Ibn Sudan* also went Top Ten, a first in U.S. Nationals history. He is one of only four sires bred in the U.S. or imported to the U.S. who has sired a U.S. National Champion Stallion (*Ansata Ibn Sudan*) and a U.S. National Champion Mare (*Fa Halima*). "Sudan's dam is **Ansata Bint Mabrouka*, who was also a champion when shown, foaled many champions all over the world was sired by *Nazeer* and foaled out of *Mabrouka*, dam to **Morafic*, halter and park champion.

*Ansata Imperial's dam is Ansata Delilah who is sired by Ansata Shah Zaman, who is the result of inbreeding *Morafic and his full sister *Ansata Bint Mabrouka. Ansata Delilah was an exceptional producer of classic individuals and her dam, *Ansata Bint Misr, was imported in utero from Egypt and exported back to the Middle East as a mature mare. Imperial Im Mamul's dam is Imperial Mamoulah, a grey mare sired by Serenity Osiris and out of SF BTB T Mamlouka, both by *Khofo. Serenity Osiris, a halter champion, was tall and a great athlete. He produced eleven National Champions and reserves, along with a number of race winners. His dam, Serenity Bint Nadia was imported in 1970 and was also a jumper champion in Egypt and Grand Champion Halter mare in Canada. SF BTBT Mamlouka, a halter champion, produced many great champions. Her dam was SF Bint Mamlouka, was also imported in 1970. *Khofo, a *Morafic son, produced 252 children and over half of them became International Champions. No other straight Egyptian stallion has yet accomplished this.*

*JRs Von Imperial's dam, Von Seraphina, is by Anchor Hill Maruf, an Ibn Mahrouf son, and out of Von Dorcasarah. Ibn Mahrouf had a rare Babson pedigree having no lines to the prolific Ibn Fa-Serr. He was a lovely stallion, leggy, graceful and fluid in movement. He was a full brother to Bint Serr Abba who had been successfully shown at Halter by the Babson farm. His dam, Serr Abba, was a lovely black mare, who was quite popular with Babson Farm visitors. Ibn Mahrouf's sire was Mahrouf, the 1972 stallion who was undefeated Park Champion in Region XI, Champion in Formal Combination and Formal Driving. Mahrouf was a leading sire at the Babson Farm for many year. Mahrouf's sire, Fabah (*Fadl x *Bint Bint Sabbah) placed fourth in Combination at the 1955 Chicago All-Arabian show. He sired and grandsired many National winners. Fabah's sire *Fadl was bred by Prince Mohammed Ali of Egypt. *Fadl sired 74 registered purebred Arabian foals of which 34 of them were Straight Babson Arabians. Fabah's dam, *Bint Bint Sabbah, is the source for the rabicano coloring found in most Babson horses. Anchor Hill Maruf's dam was Anchor Hill Hasha (Hadbah x Sarah), a champion at Halter, Western Pleasure, English Pleasure, Trail, Jumping and Stock Horse. Von Seraphina's dam, Von Dorcasarah, is by Amyr Count Dorsan and out of PF Dorateza. Amyr Count Dorsan's sire and dam shared the same father, Count Dorsaz. *Count Dorsaz was imported from England to the USA in 1958 on lease by Bazy Tankersley. *Count Dorsaz was a pure Crabbet stallion. *Count Dorsaz was twice the winner of the coveted Winston Churchill Award for the best riding horse of all breeds. He sired 185 registered foals before his death at the ripe old age of 31. He sired 15 National Winners and is the only Crabbet stallion to sire both a US National Champion Stallion and a US National Champion Park Horse. Twenty-two of his gets have produced National winners. Von Dorcasarah's dam, PF Dorateza, a *Count Dorsaz granddaughter, had a sire (Maratez) who was a Witez II grandson.*
